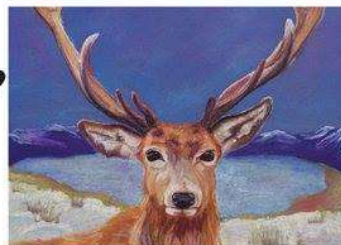

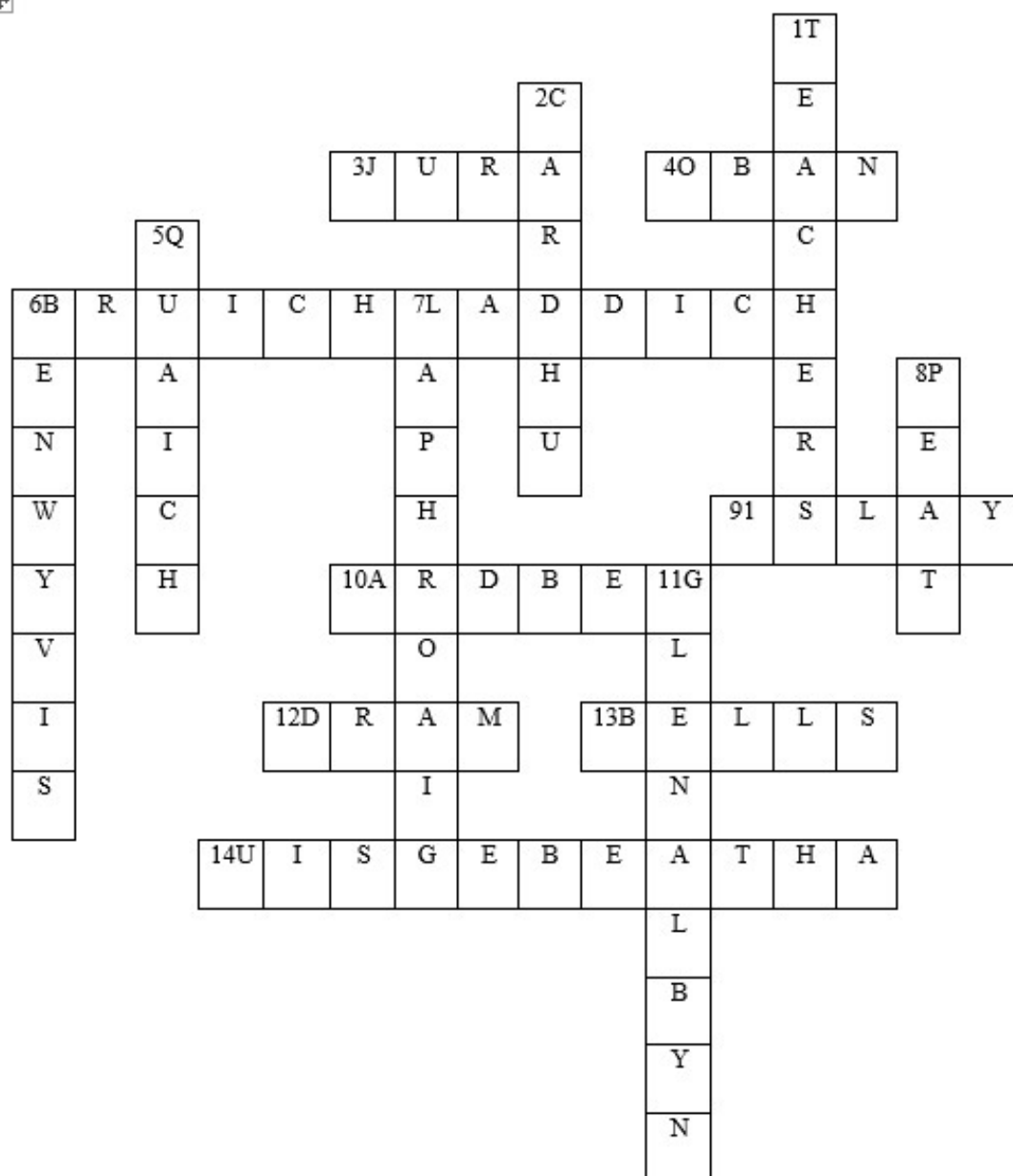


The studio is located on the road to Glen Affric approximately 200m outside the village on the right.
