Spring is the air

Welcome to the gardening column!

Spring is here and despite the unseasonal dry spell of weather the plants in the garden appear to be thriving well. However, the recent rainfall, whilst welcome, has seen the reappearance of armies of slugs and snails that have just been waiting their chance to chomp on our favourite garden plants. I try to follow an environmentally friendly regime in order to control them, but this is not always possible. Try laying a beer trap or putting small course gravel or chip around the area of plants/individual plants as they do not like crossing it. There is no failsafe idea so a combination of different ones may give you the best results.



Skimmia japonica 'rubella' (pictured) is an easy to grow plant suitable for our climate here and should be widely available. It grows to around 1.5m with around 1.5m spread and can be grown in containers as well as the garden in a sheltered spot. Flowering time is March to May but our later season means it should still flower into June. The small white fragrant flowers attract bees and butterflies and are followed by red berries which will feed an assortment of birds. It is an evergreen and therefore keeps its' dark green leaves throughout the year and in late winter the small red flower buds appear awaiting the warmer spring weather to open.

And I'm feeling happy right down to my core.


So if ever your feeling empty and low,
